¹² The word of God is living and active,

²⁰ He said to him, “Teacher, I have kept all these since my
youth.”
²¹ Jesus, looking at him, loved him and said,

and you will have treasure in heaven;
then come, follow me.”
²² When he heard this,
he was shocked and went away grieving,

But Jesus said to them again,

“Then who can be saved?”
²⁷ Jesus looked at them and said,
“For mortals it is impossible, but not for God;
for God all things are possible.”
²⁸ Peter began to say to him,
“Look, we have left everything and followed you.”
²⁹ Jesus said, “Truly I tell you
there is no one who has left house or brothers or sisters
or mother or father or children or fields,
for my sake and for the sake of the good news,
³⁰ who will not receive a hundredfold now in this age—
houses, brothers and sisters, mothers and children, and fields,
with persecutions—and in the age to come eternal life.
