A Reading from the second letter of Paul to the Corinthians

⁷ We have this treasure in clay jars,
so that it may be made clear
that this extraordinary power belongs to God
and does not come from us.
⁸ We are afflicted in every way, but not crushed;
perplexed, but not driven to despair;
⁹ persecuted, but not forsaken;
struck down, but not destroyed;
¹⁰ always carrying in the body the death of Jesus,
so that the life of Jesus may also be made visible in our bodies.
¹¹ For while we live,
we are always being given up to death for Jesus' sake,
so that the life of Jesus
may be made visible in our mortal flesh.
¹² So death is at work in us
but life in you.
¹³ But just as we have the same spirit of faith
that is in accordance with scripture—
“I believed, and so I spoke”—
we also believe, and so we speak,
¹⁴ because we know that the one who raised the Lord Jesus
will raise us also with Jesus,
and will bring us with you into his presence.
¹⁵ Yes, everything is for your sake,
so that grace, as it extends to more and more people,
may increase thanksgiving, to the glory of God.

27 and whoever wishes to be first among you
