Giving of Communion

The president says the invitation to communion

I heard the voice of a great multitude crying 'Alleluia'.
The Lord our God has entered into his kingdom.
**Blessed are those who are called to the supper
of the Lamb.**

**Eternal God and Father,
whose Son at supper prayed that His disciples
might be one, as He is one with you:
draw us closer to Him
in this bread and this wine,
that in love and obedience to you
we may be united to one another
in the fellowship of the one Spirit,
that the world may believe that He is Lord,
to your eternal glory;
through the same Jesus Christ our Redeemer.
Amen.**
