you will be saved.

¹⁰ For one believes with the heart and so is justified,
and one confesses with the mouth and so is saved.

¹¹ The scripture says,

“No one who believes in him will be put to shame.”

¹² For there is no distinction between Jew and Greek;
the same Lord is Lord of all
and is generous to all who call on him.

¹³ For, “Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord shall be
